Family: Pycnonotidae

Origin: India, Andaman Islands, Myanmar, Nepal, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Thailand, Vietnam, northern Malay

Peninsula, Laos, Cambodia, China, and South Africa.

Distribution: Found below 2,000 meters elevation, widely distributed in the rural forested areas, urban parks,

and areas with trees throughout Hong Kong.

Body Length: 18-20 cm

Body Characteristics: Distinctive upright black crest on the head. Head and crest are black, with a red patch below the eye,

white cheeks, and brown body with a white belly. Adults have a black crest and red cheek patches, with

an orange-red vent. Juveniles lack the red cheek patches.

Features: Present throughout the year

Diet: Omnivorous, feeding primarily on fruits and insects. Feeds nestlings with soft-bodied insects initially, then

moves on to feeding them drupes and berries.
